
eSmart Schools

On Tuesday 9th September, students in grade 4 to 6 took part in a live, interactive Virtual Classroom Incursion, to discover how to protect themselves online with practical tools such as creating strong passwords and managing privacy settings. Using a scenario, students explored how to spot the warning signs and trust their body clues when interacting with others online, as well as identifying the qualities of a trusted adult if students need support online. This is a great empowerment for students knowing how to be safe online.



The third lesson in our eSmart safety unit has been **Contact.**

Contact focused on learning how to identify and respond to misinformation shared with them by family, friends, ads or other online sources. Throughout the lesson, students developed critical thinking skills to pause, recognise their emotional response and decide on appropriate actions, such as ignoring false information or informing a trusted adult.




Mrs Rollinson's Class

FUN FRIDAY




Elphinstone CFA Safety Event
